

ONE OF THE HARDEST THINGS FOR A PASTOR OF **A GREAT CHURCH** LIKE CREEKSIDE **IS FIGURING OUT** WHAT KIND OF SERMONS SHOULD **BE PRESENTED FROM** THE PULPIT ON SUNDAY MORNINGS. **IT'S A DAUNTING** TASK. I talk to God about it; I consider the building momentum of what has been previously presented; I look at the current spiritual condition of who attends Creekside; I try to get a feel for what is happening in our nation and world; I consult with other pastors here at Creekside. And from this puzzle-process, the Lord somehow always seems to lead exactly where we need to go!

So after such a powerful series like SPIRITUAL WARFARE, where do we go from here? Well, in case you might be tempted to think that the "sermon temperature" around Creekside is coming down, let me clue you in on what is coming next. 30 A.D. – THE JESUS STORY.


Starting November 19, we will begin the amazing journey of working through the Gospel according to Luke. Now each of the four gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) in the New Testament offer us unique perspectives on the birth, life, ministry, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. But Luke's gospel kind of glows in the dark when I read it! Here are some of the features of the Gospel of Luke that make this book so special:

GENTILE AUTHOR

This is the only gospel written by a non-Jewish author. And from the very beginning of Luke, we begin to see Jesus not only as Israel's Messiah, but the Savior of the World. With Luke, the good news goes global! (That's a big deal since most of us here at Creekside don't come from a Jewish background.)

ATTENTION TO DETAIL

Luke gives us very specific details about the life of Christ that are often not found in the other gospels. His introduction speaks of a time period where

he interviewed eye witnesses and gathered meticulous facts about Jesus. Remember, Luke was a doctor by trade... and you know how doctors can be! BTW, only Luke writes a follow-up volume after the resurrection of Jesus about the early history of the Church (the Book of Acts). Details matter.

EMPHASIS ON THE HUMANITY OF CHRIST

Luke has been rightly "accused" of presenting the most human picture of Jesus Christ found among the four gospels. The way our Lord interacts with people makes you feel like you can see Him, smell Him, hear Him breathing, and touch Him. With a little imagination you feel like you are present as Jesus beautifully meets human needs and administers the compassion of heaven to person, after person, after person. Yes, Jesus is God in the flesh. But Luke brilliantly presents Him as the perfect human being as well.

APPRECIATION FOR WOMEN

In a culture that was very male dominant, it is refreshing how Luke brings so many women in and out of the gospel story. And unlike many ancient authors, Luke presents these various women as some of the greatest spiritual heroes and examples of bold faith in action. Since over half of the family of God is female, this artistic touch is extremely encouraging!

FOCUS ON THE HOLY SPIRIT

Apart from JOHN 14-16, no other gospel writer places such an emphasis on the presence, power and working of the Holy Spirit as we find in the Gospel of Luke. Without the writing of Luke in the New Testament, our understanding of the Holy Spirit and His work in our lives would simply not be complete. Have I whet your appetite yet? Hope so! AND THERE'S MORE:

The Gospel of Luke gives us information not found elsewhere about what leads up to the birth of Jesus Christ. That makes this gospel the perfect diving board for moving into the Christmas season! The Christmas story doesn't really begin with the incarnation of Christ, but rather with the details of the birth of the forerunner of Christ... John the Baptist! The opening chapter of Luke wishes you and me a very Merry Christmas! So here we go with 30 A.D. -THE JESUS STORY according to Luke!



WHERE FAITH & POP CULTURE MEET

"God, I know you love me, and I love you."

Lysa touched hearts sharing that she is in "a season of suffering," yet she has joy despite her circumstances. "It's not easy to do as we are being pressed living between two gardens... There is no perfection this side of eternity, except through Christ."

Despite devastating news about her marriage and her family's pain about her husband's addiction and marital infidelity, she trusts God who uses all things for good emphasizing that no matter what we face, we can find joy. As a result of going public, she found that sharing their circumstances unleashed "an army of prayer support."



Throughout Lysa's teaching, she noted that often we play "the comparison game" and that social media largely adds fuel to the fire about how our lives "should look." But she says that's "deception from the enemy."

Instead she suggested asking ourselves "what am I saturating my mind with?"

may mean starting our days with the Bible, not social media.

Saturday, Kerri Pomarolli who emphasizes that she is a Christian and a comedian working in mainstream Hollywood uses humor as a way to stay connected and to find joy in tough times. "God loves the weird ones," she shared, as she definitely had the women laughing.

The stand-up comedian shared her memory of hearing God's voice saying, "You have a big mouth and a crazy family, I can use you." Her message included her words to "take heart; we aren't all the same. We all have purpose."

Kerri also referred back to Lysa's

message of "Living Loved," and choosing to forgive others as a part of that.

One participant from San Francisco, Becky Wilson shares that she uses the "First 5 app" from Lysa's Proverbs 31 Ministries to begin her day with a Bible verse and connecting with God. The idea is that we give the first five minutes of our days to God's Word, not the world's worries.

Mother of four Beth Mammet says her favorite part of the teaching was Lysa's sharing of her personal story that God works in her life even in the difficult times. "I guess I try and see God in everything," Beth says. "When I iron clothes for my kids, I pray over each part of them. When I am frustrated with housework, I think about glorifying Him by being faithful in my responsibilities."

Joanne Doolittle says hearing Lysa's honesty about walking through a "season of suffering" was authentic and relatable. Joanne attended the conference with a good friend, and says she loves personal connections made through a woman's group.

Prayer, time in God's Word, humor and face-to-face connections can help us find joy no matter what circumstances we find ourselves in here on Earth, or in this garden as Lysa puts it. She adds we can do our part to "Bring the atmosphere we want to live in" regarding living joy-filled lives.

She also suggested following the command Jesus gave his

disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane to "Keep watch." Keeping watch together may also make this journey easier and sweeter.

Lysa shared a prayer she says repeatedly every night, "God, I know you love me, and I love you."


For all of us, this simple truth never changes, no matter what life here on Earth may bring.

CONNECT SERVE REACH Dy JENNIFER SAME

It was Valentine's Day weekend 2015 as Jerry and I were celebrating our 27th anniversary with a trip to Point Arena, along the northern California coast. Just a few steps from our cabin we could clearly see the lighthouse, so we headed out across the field to make our way towards it. As we were walking, I remember saying, "This would make a great object lesson about being focused on a target and heading straight for it. When we fix our eyes on Jesus, it's easy to stay in the right direction."

But it wasn't long before we found ourselves surrounded by muddy earth hidden beneath the meadow. The farther we went, the more we continued sinking in the mire. We finally decided to avoid the beautiful green field and make our way back to the road. Later that day, we asked about an easier way to get to the lighthouse, and we were told there was a path along the cliff. Sure enough, the next day we took the longer route and enjoyed a beautiful pathway along land's end, surveying the expansive blue Pacific and easily reaching the lighthouse. And I realized that my original idea for an object lesson would need to be tweaked. Yes, we still need to fix our eyes on Jesus, but sometimes the seemingly straight line isn't the best path.




As Christ-followers, we are called to be disciples and to make disciples—MATTHEW 28:18-20. As a matter of fact, Creekside's mission statement is that "we exist to bring glory to God by turning all people into fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ." But what does that mean? What is a disciple? What path do we follow to become disciples?

A disciple of Jesus Christ is someone who is continuously

learning to live and love like Jesus and leads others to do the same. To help people become disciples, we have defined a "Discipleship Pathway," made up of four components: Connect, Grow, Serve, and Reach all of which transpire in an atmosphere of worship.

CONNECT: The first stop is all about connecting connecting with God, and connecting with the Church. We are a cross-generational, cross - cultural congregation, and we welcome all people wherever they are along their spiritual journey. It is our desire that everyone would come to connect with God and know Him in a personal way by accepting His gift of salvation through the sacrifice of His Son Jesus on the cross. The next faith-step of water baptism is core, as we identify with the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus in



a symbol of a commitment to Him. Once people have connected with God through salvation by faith and followed Him obediently in baptism, it is our hope that they would connect with Creekside Christian Church through membership.

GROW: The next step is growing in relationship with God (vertically) and in relationship with other Christ-followers (horizontally). We offer core opportunities for growth here at Creekside, both in relationship with each other and in relationship with God. Our LifeGroups are fundamental, as almost 80 small groups meet each week to spend time together developing Christian friendships and in digging deeper into scripture. Creekside also offers several Core Workshops. From the basics to deeper studies, these opportunities are designed to help you cultivate healthy spiritual habits for growth.

SERVE: As people serve, they move closer to Jesus, and we have a variety of opportunities for you to serve. Some are easy for anyone, like helping with our annual Harvest Festival; and some are more intense, like leading a Bible study. Some are weekly, like teaching or helping in children's Sunday School, and some are occasional, like assisting with baptism or communion. Some take place behind the scenes, like setting up auditorium chairs each week; and some take place up front, like singing or performing with a worship team. Some are relational, like greeting or leading a small group; and some are administrative, like assisting with office projects.

It is our desire that everyone serves out of their personal SHAPE—Spiritual Gifts, Heart, Abilities, Personality, and Experiences—so we offer SHAPE Workshops three times a year to help you discover how God uniquely designed you to serve.

REACH: The fourth point on our Discipleship Pathway is Reach. We want everyone to be able to share their own faith stories, and we offer workshops several times a year to teach you to do this. We would also like everyone to get involved in at least one mission experience. What is a mission experience, you ask? It might be helping with Winter Sanctuary, delivering shoes to disadvantaged kids, participating in a community workday. Or it might have a global focus, like traveling on a short-term overseas mission trip.

All of this connecting, growing, serving and reaching happens in an atmosphere of worship. Worship is the loving response of a person when he or she encounters God or His actions. Sometimes the activities involved in engaging the Pathway help people to encounter Jesus, and sometimes encountering Jesus inspires people to take next steps. Regardless, our hope is that people will worship with all of their hearts, and no matter where they are on the journey, worship becomes the equalizer.

Without question, the Pathway is not always linear. You can get involved wherever you feel most comfortable to jump on. And just as pathways meander a bit, you might find yourself hopping from point to point along our Pathway or being in multiple places at once.

Most important, the Pathway is all about movement. We want you to move closer to Jesus, and our Discipleship Pathway is our way to help you take those steps. So join us on this lifelong journey, and let's walk along this Pathway together.

For some, the holiday season is a chance to see family near and far, and for others, well, you may have the same sentiment as George Burns who once said, "Happiness is having a large, loving, caring, close-knit family in another city."

Let's be honest, the holiday season can also bring a great deal of stress. Maybe you have the over-competitive sibling or the parent who just can't be pleased or satisfied. But still they are your family and you can't just say no when they say, "let's get together this Christmas."

So let me give you some tips on how to give yourself and others some grace this holiday season.

DON'T TAKE YOURSELF TOO SERIOUSLY.

This may come as a huge surprise to everyone, but I am not perfect. I know, crazy right? Everyone makes mistakes. We need to give ourselves (and others) a little more grace. What you do does not define you; what your kids do does not define you; what your spouse does or does not do does not define you; and what your parents and siblings think about you does not define you.

So when your sibling keeps pointing out how small your house is or your parents ask you if you are really roasting beef and not baking a ham for Christmas dinner, just smile and remember: don't take things too seriously.

YOU HAVE NOTHING TO PROVE TO ANYBODY.

This is where a lot of family dynamics get "wonky." We keep trying to prove ourselves to others. Remember we are not called to please others, we live to please God, so let's be who God has called us to be. To Him you are enough. If you find yourself trying to prove yourself, but can't seem to be enough for your parents and siblings, then you are on a straight path to stress and depression. So remember, "I am enough for God!"

DON'T BE DEFENSIVE WITH OTHER PEOPLE.

Help them learn that you aren't going to prove yourself to them and that they also don't need to prove themselves to you. Just offer grace.

When hot button topics come up in the conversation—religion, politics etc.—politely change the conversation. Take time to pause before you answer questions. If you feel your blood pressure rising during a conversation, make sure to stop, take a deep breath and maybe even take a step outside or excuse yourself to the restroom.

ALWAYS ASSUME GOOD MOTIVES IN OTHERS.

I live with the motto that it's better to be gullible than cynical. This is hard for me to do at times, but life is so much better when we assume and possibly even strive to look for the good in others. If I assume my parents and siblings love me and want the best for me, their idiosyncrasies diminish greatly.

When you do this you will also find that you become less defensive, realize you have nothing to prove and will learn to not take yourself so seriously.

Although the current estimate for the proposed work is greater than the earmarked amount, the largest portion of the cost is due to necessary upgrades to sync the chapel with the auditorium's audio and video systems. Over the next several months more work will be done to find other possible design solutions and to apportion funds for design, installation, equipment and construction costs.

> To this point, conceptual designs have been completed. The next step will be to move to architectural designs: blueprints, schematic, and technical drawings. This will happen over the next several months and will necessitate an updated cost assessment.

> New teams of volunteers, new service options, new leadership opportunities and new faces will all be a part of this new worship expression.

> Please continue to pray as we work to make this ministry possibility a reality. CL



"How do we kindly connect with people who believe differently than we do?"



by **SCOTTY HALLMAN, LEAD WORSHIP PASTOR** indness starts with an understanding of Shalom. Shalom is not just peace but it's where everything is in harmony. When God created the Earth, he created it to be in Shalom: in harmony, balance and togetherness.

Ultimately, this is what we are called to be doing as Christfollowers—trying to bring Shalom to the Earth. In doing so, we must work to keep division and separation from happening in relationships while still maintaining an understanding of who God is, as a holy, set apart and perfect God.

So what does that mean for us as imperfect Christ-followers? It means we need to understand who we are in Christ. If we don't understand who we are in Christ then we will be, or rather could be, reactive to others to define who we are. If we know who we are in Christ and we have that understanding, we can approach others with helpful postures.

Another aspect that helps us connect with kindness is to try our very best to understand where someone is coming from, even if we disagree. Listening is necessary for this to happen. Sometimes the reason we don't get along with people is because we just don't take the time to understand who someone is and what they are trying to communicate. We can do this by learning their personal stories.

Being willing to listen, acknowledge and understand someone during and after a discussion, even if we don't agree, could better help us relate (in kindness) which will ultimately aid in bringing wholeness, or Shalom, to the Earth.

As the Program director, Lindy understands that the Shining Stars staff might be the first point of contact to many families. In order to encourage students and their families, Lindy works hard to keep continuity in staff and have low turnover.


"I consider the Shining Stars staff a family," Lindy said. "It has been an amazing experience," she continues as she thinks about the growth of Shining Stars.


Lindy, along with her team, looks forward to many more impactful school years in Elk Grove.


