



Because God is relational and lives in community—God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit—and He created us to be relational and in community—with Him and with each other.

God tells us over and over in His Word that we need each other. The Christian life was never meant to be lived alone. At Creekside, we have LifeGroups for this very reason. Our goal for LifeGroups is simply to help velcro the two things we need most—the Bible and other Christ followers. This is especially true when facing hard times. Our hope (and prayer) is that significant, Christ-centered relationships are fostered. After two years of sermon-based LifeGroups, we are learning that whenever a group of believers gather together to share their lives, pray, and discuss the biblical text and life application of Sunday's sermon, good stuff happens. God shows up and He often shows off! LifeGroups provide a powerful mixture of God's Spirit, His people and the Scriptures—which allows for organic growth. Each group takes on its own flavor, based on the people in the group and the things happening in their lives.

The simple process of regularly handling the Scriptures and looking into them to see what they say sets the stage for spiritual growth. God has answers in His Word, no matter what situation we face. LifeGroups who live life together allow for a warm hug, wise counsel or swift kick in the rear, just when it's needed. LifeGroups allow us to be close enough to other Christians to benefit from their knowledge and support.

WHAT IS A LIFEGROUP?

LifeGroups are in-home groups of approximately 10-14 Creekside adults who gather weekly during three sessions a year to share, pray, study God's Word and discuss the Sunday sermon. The focus is on the previous Sunday's sermon using Discussion Questions provided on the back of the weekly sermon notes or on the Creekside app or website. Weekly meetings typically last about 90 minutes. Together, we seek to grow as we discover how the biblical principles presented during the sermon apply to the realities of everyday living.

We also encourage one another through One Another Christianity...

- Bear with one another —EPHESIANS 4:2
- Encourage one another— 1 THESSALONIANS 5:11
- Carry one another's burdens —GALATIANS 6:2
- Confess sins to one another—JAMES 5:16
- Pray for one another—JAMES 5:16
- Live in harmony with one another—ROMANS 12:16
- Spur one another on toward love and good deeds—HEBREWS 10:24
- Fellowship with one another—1 JOHN 1:7
- ...and more!

LifeGroups provide an opportunity for the Holy Spirit to do His work.


HOW DO I JOIN A LIFEGROUP?

Signing up for a group is easy. If it's not a good fit, or if life gets too busy and you need a break, rolling off is easy too! We have three sessions per year—winter, spring and fall. Signups happen every August, January and April and sessions usually run about 10 weeks. We take breaks for the summer months, and during the Christmas and Easter Holidays.

Leader/Host bio's and group specifics are provided during signups so that you can select a group that best fits your needs—day of the week, location, interests and stage of life.

Try a group for three weeks and if it's not a good fit, it's okay to try another group. No questions asked! We hope you will give it a try and allow the Lord an opportunity to help you connect with Him and with others. LifeGroups=Folks going together in the same direction to grow in their love for Christ and each other.

CREEKSIDE PASTOR ANSWERS YOUR DIFFICULT QUESTIONS

Why do bad things happen?

s I write these words I'm staring at the majestic scenery of Hume Lake in the heart of Kings Canyon National Park. The sun is rising over a still lake nestled among towering pine trees and the majestic snow-capped mountains as a backdrop. The perfect postcard.

But this year my eyes are drawn to the forest which has been thinned by the massive wildfire that recently tore through here. I can't help but wonder why things like this happen.

As tragic as this fire was, we've all seen much worse: tsunamis in Asia, earthquakes in Haiti, fires and floods that exact a tremendous toll of human life, not to mention diseases and injuries, or the suffering we see inflicted by humanity: violence, sex slavery, or terrorists brutally taking lives. And then, there's that thing they did to you. We've all asked, "Why do bad things happen?" It's a valid question. And there's no easy answer... but let me offer a few observations:

OBSERVATION #1

When we ask the question, we're betraying an innate sense of morality and justice. We label some things good—and we expect these things in our lives—and we label other things bad—which automatically means that we don't want anything to do with them. Sensing that some things are bad or evil suggests that there really is a God who determines what is good and right, not arbitrarily, but by His very character. This clues us in to our expectation that it shouldn't be this way. Leading to observation number 2...

OBSERVATION #2

When we feel as though it shouldn't be this way, we then hope for something better. As a Christ-follower, I believe in God who created all things perfect and will someday make all things perfect again. Until then, our world is marred by sin and brokenness. Not only are we sinful and broken individually but the whole creation is less than it should be. Bad things we encounter are typically a result of sin and brokenness. Frankly, the Christian story is the only way to make sense of this tension of brokenness and beauty, pain and perfection. Someday perfection will be achieved again—not by us, but by Jesus Christ.

OBSERVATION #3

So until God makes all things right again, what should our response to suffering be? One man who went through much suffering once challenged us to rejoice "in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; character, hope" ROMANS 5:3-4. Easier said than done. But I've seen this work in my life and in others'. The hope of a world without pain and suffering is no mere pipe dream. It's a reality that we can grasp through the tough stuff.

So, friend: Hold on to Jesus.

I remember standing on the edge of the high-diving board at the local public pool in the middle of July. I was a good swimmer, and I had often dived into the pool from the low board. But this was different. This was scary.

I was so high up in the air, and the water was so far down below. I had seen other people dive in, and it looked like it would be fun. But did I have enough courage to try it myself? Standing at the edge and peering down over my toes, teenage boys urging me on from behind, it took all my

effort to finally make the plunge. Was it a graceful swan dive? Was it an elegant jackknife? No, I think it was probably a loud, splashy, kerplunk—well, as loud and splashy as a nine-year-old girl can be. But as I rose to the surface, I was exhilarated! I had done it! The rest of the afternoon found me repeatedly climbing up the ladder and plummeting into the pool, jumping in over and over again. I had finally gone ALL IN and I was hooked!

Just like diving into a pool, when it comes to serving in the church, it's easy to sit on

the sidelines and watch others dive in. They make it look so simple. They make it look like fun. Yet we don't always want to try it ourselves. Are we afraid of belly flopping? Is it too much effort? Are there too many complications in our lives? Are we just willing to let others do the work while we observe and reap the benefits? There are all kinds of excuses, but the truth is that God has created each one of us to go ALL IN.

EPHESIANS 2:10 tells us that "we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do



good works, which
God prepared in advance
for us to do." This verse is
a wonderful reminder that
we are not here by chance,
and the Creator Himself has
intentionally planned good
works for us to do. What a
great honor to know that each
one of us is God's masterpiece,
specifically created to do those
good works.

As we read further in Ephesians, chapter 4 tells us that God has given each of us gifts so that we can do works of service and build up the body of Christ. Imagine the Church as God

intended it to be: equipped for ministry, unified in the faith, growing in the knowledge of the Son of God, becoming spiritually mature, and attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ! This is what happens when we devote ourselves to becoming followers of Jesus and living as He did—giving ourselves in service to others!

Is this work burdensome? It needn't be. Because God has created us with unique gifts to serve in the place He has prepared for us, we can be excited and enthusiastic about volunteering in the church! When we find our "sweet spot" of serving and are using our God-given gifts and abilities to further God's Kingdom, we become renewed, refreshed, invigorated, and energized to do more!

What if I invited you to have dinner with me? You are excited to catch up, see how I have been. When I meet you at the restaurant I tell you, "Oh by the way I have invited a few hundred of my other friends to join us." How would you feel? I think it would shock me a bit, definitely make me feel not as important as I felt when you first asked me out to dinner.

Or imagine tucking your kids in at night or turning in for the night with your spouse and again you invite a few hundred other people with you! Kind of awkward don't you think.

Do you realize when you check every message on your phone when you are out to eat, tucking the kids in at night or before you go to sleep, essentially you just invited hundreds of people and a multitude more distractions into those moments? There are times I read stories to my kids that are on my phone, or I watch sports highlights with my wife before I go to bed. But I encourage you to read the Intersection article on page 18 called "Do you control your smart phone or does your smart phone control you?" and honestly answer that question.

Now I am going to admit. I am not perfect when it comes to shutting down my phone, but I do know I want to be more all in with my family. I want to be a better husband and father, and I know that means I need to take control over my phone instead of letting my phone control me.

So I want to share a few things I have learned, tried, sometimes failed at, and tried again to help me be more All In with my family.

MOVE YOUR DEVICE AWAY FROM YOU

I have found that if my phone isn't on me, especially when I am at home, I am less likely to check on it every time it beeps, dings,

tweets, and rings. When you are at home treat it like a home phone. Put it in one location, and you determine when you answer its beckoning noises.

PUT YOUR PHONE ON MUTE

Speaking of beckoning noises, try putting it on mute every once in awhile. Make a family agreement during certain times of the day—meal times, bed times, you decide—to turn off the noise.

The one time during the day that I strongly encourage you to put your phone on mute when you are driving. The great thing about phones is that the information will be there for you whenever you look at it, even when you are done driving to your next location. Believe it or not, others can wait, your life and your family are more important.

TURN OFF NOTIFICATIONS

Try going the extra mile and tell your phone to make fewer noises. Do we really need our Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram feeds 24/7? I have to admit I like knowing sports scores and news stories as they are happening, so I need help with this as well. But even if we try turning off one app's notification at a time, our lives will be more open and free.

INTERSECTION WHERE FAITH & POP CULTURE MEET

The year was 2005. My wife and I were walking through what used to be the K Street Mall in downtown Sacramento and we stopped at a cell phone kiosk. The iPhone was two years away but the Motorola Razr had just been released.

Prior to this day I had prided myself in not owning a cell phone. I shuddered at the thought of anyone being able to reach me, anytime, anywhere. However we were entering the child birthing years and my wife convinced me that being able to reach me while she was pregnant was a good thing. It wasn't long until I not only had a cell phone with me wherever I went, but I no longer had a home phone line.

It was only 2 years later when I held my first iPhone. It was amazing! The touch screen, the apps... I could zoom in with only two fingers onto a map and see where I lived. Now not only could people call me and text me anytime, anywhere, but they could also email me and Facebook message me as well!

Today there isn't much our cell phones can't do. If you can think of it, there is

probably an app for it. This is extremely helpful in a lot of circumstances. It can also be very harmful if we aren't careful.

Apple says that iPhone users unlock their phones 80 times a day. Even worse, we tap, type and swipe our smartphones more than 2,600 times a day, on average. Just in case you forgot, there are only 24 hours in a day. That averages out

to more than 100 times an hour. The majority of us check our phones in front of our kids, during meetings, while we eat and while we should be sleeping.

Have you ever felt a bit of anxiety when you are forced to be away from your phone? It's not imaginary; it is what true addiction feels like.

Researchers have shown that when we receive a text, a "like" on our Facebook post, or Instagram photo, our brain releases a chemical called dopamine which makes us

feel good. So we reach for our phones constantly to check to see if anything is new so we can get a hit of that Dopamine. So when you get 12 likes on that great Instagram selfie, your brain gives you a positive feeling not unlike the feeling you receive when taking heroin or cocaine.

Our cell phones are neither good nor evil, so I am not going to say that our phones are equal to the dangers of cocaine and heroin. But we have to ask ourselves honestly, do we control our phone or does our phone control us?

If we aren't careful they can steal our focus away from family, friends and the general things of life happening around us. Life passes you by and you are tacitly saying that you value your time on your phone over the people you love.

When we look back at our lives, it's highly unlikely that anyone will wish they had spent more time staring at their phones. 👊



TONY LEADS MEN'S MINISTRY AT CREEKSIDE AS AN INTERN THROUGH SIOUX FALLS SEMINARY (KAIROS PROJECT).

HE JOINS THE CREEKSIDE TEAM AFTER 28 YEARS IN THE DEPT. OF CORRECTIONS INCLUDING THE U.S. MARSHAL'S TASK FORCE AND A VOLUNTEER CHAPLAIN AT RIO COSUMNES CORRECTIONAL CENTER.

HE AND HIS WIFE HAVE TWO SONS, A DAUGHTER-IN-LAW AND TWO GRANDCHILDREN. Looking up from his salad, Tony Bell put down his fork and recalled the story like it happened yesterday.

"I can remember the play. Coach called a two gap. I was playing middle linebacker at the time."

The year was 1980. Bell, then a Sophomore, had just transferred to Hiram Johnson High School in Sacramento. He was having a hard time trying to fit in at his new school, but he knew earning a spot on the varsity football team would help. He was facing one of the best Seniors on the team.

"He came through the line and I just lit him up. Just laid him out. It changed everything. It changed his demeanor towards me. He had a respect for me. From then, I started to have an understanding that it's going to be okay. People aren't going to continue to walk on you. That's when things really started to change."

The changes for Tony wouldn't be limited to just the football field. His grandmother passed away that same year, which turned out to be the catalyst for him to take a close look at his faith and his relationship with God.

"I said to God, at the age of 16, that if you are exactly who you say you are, I'll serve you until the day I die. If not, I don't want to be like so many people that are fans of Christ. It's either going to be real or not." It was real, and to this day Tony's faith continues to set the foundation for every aspect of his life.

A neighbor, who Tony describes as a father figure growing up, was a Sacramento County Sheriff and the one who steered Bell to what would turn out to be a 30-year career in law enforcement and corrections.

Bell's background gives him a unique position to use his ministry in places most would struggle.

"When I talk to people, it's not just to be talking to them. God has given me a love for them. I desire for them to do well in Him and I desire for them to truly know Him so

they can experience the power that comes only from Him. I can walk any street, I can go to any neighborhood, I can go to any jail. God said I'll make even your enemies be at peace with you. He made that real to me."

Tony and his wife Gayle—married now for 31-years and with two grown boys—are both active members at Creekside Christian. Tony is also in the first year of seminary, continuing to focus on men's ministry.

"You will never see a church thrive without men being given the opportunity to be strong and grow and serve."


"God's purpose is to help men come to know God in the way of fulfilling the great commission. The scripture that always comes to mind is teaching men what it means to come after Christ. To take up your cross and follow him. That is God's goal for us so it became my goal for men."

As one of the driving forces behind the monthly men's huddle at Creekside, Bell draws back on his football days to describe his vision for the men of Creekside going forward.

"One of the things about the men's ministry that's my goal this year is that we break huddle. We're not going to just continue to huddle. A football team, if they only huddle, they're going to get destroyed. You've got to get in the game."

Tony Bell has been in the game his whole life, and, if you ask him, he's just getting started.

"I would be lost without ministry. It rocks my world. It really does. It really does."
