PURITY DEFINED

- Not <u>mixed</u> or <u>adulterated</u> with any <u>other</u>
 substance or material
 - ▶Illus: Pure gold (Exodus 25:17) pure oil (Leviticus 24:2)
 - pure wool (Daniel 7:9)
- Pree from moral _______ or ______ (1Timothy 5:22)

 ►Illus: (God's) Pure commands (Psalm 119:127) pure offerings (Malachi 1:11) pure joy (James 1:2) pure wisdom (James 3:17) pure spiritual milk (crave it!) (1 Peter 2:2) pure (clear/clean) conscience (1 Timothy 3:9)

 pure virgin/bride (2 Corinthians 11:2; Hebrews 13:4; Revelation 19:7)

THE PURITY GAP

- ▶Bad News There is an enormous purity gap between God and us (Proverbs 20:9; Romans 3:10)
- ▶Good News God has done something fantastic to bridge that gap!

<u>CONFESSION</u> - CLOSING THE DISTANCE (Psalm 51:1-12)

- ► Sin Defined = to <u>think</u>, <u>speak</u> or <u>act</u> in a manner contrary to the expressed will of God... to fail to live up to God's perfect laws either by <u>commission</u> or <u>omission</u>.

- ▶Balance: Staying pure AND staying on mission (Luke 19:10; Acts 1:8; Jude 22-23)
- ▶PRINCIPLE: You cannot have <u>impact</u> without <u>contact</u>
