#### JOHN THE BAPTIST IS COMING (Luke 1:5-25)

- Setting
- ▶ During the reign of <u>Herod</u> the Great (40-4 BC)
- ▶ In the <u>Temple</u> (or House) of God at <u>Uerusalem</u>
- Recipient ► Zechariah & Elizabeth
- · Priestly family
- · Upright / Blameless
- · Childless

<u>Elderly</u>

PRINCIPLE #1: God is in control of your story.

PRINCIPLE #2: God works <u>best</u> in "<u>impossible</u>" situations.

- Messenger ► The <u>Angel Gabriel</u> (vv.11,19)
- Message ► A <u>special</u> <u>baby</u> is <u>coming</u>
- © Response ► <u>Fear</u>, <u>doubt</u> & <u>unbelief</u> (vv.18-25)

PRINCIPLE #3: God expects His people to <u>believe</u> His <u>Word</u> & <u>walk</u> in <u>faith</u>. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

- SETTING ► Nazareth (Galilee)
- 2 RECIPIENT ► Mary
- MESSENGER ► The <u>Angel Gabriel</u>
- MESSAGE ► <u>Divine</u> <u>Conception</u> of the <u>Messiah</u>
- © RESPONSE > Fear + <u>Confused</u> <u>Belief</u> & <u>Surrender</u>

PRINCIPLE #4: God-pleasing <u>faith</u> can show up where you <u>least</u> <u>expect</u> it! (Hebrews 11:1, 6)

#### **DISCOVER**

God's plan is surprising.

#### **READ**

Luke 1:5-38

The stories of John the Baptist and the coming of Christ burst with surprises. "Mary, you're going to have a baby." Surprise! "God is the father."

These may have seemed like surprising events, but each twist and turn was part of God's plan. God's plan is surprising! We just need to believe and surrender and trust that God is in control, even when things happen that we don't expect.

#### SHARE

Plan a quiet surprise for someone. Deliver hot chocolate to a friend at work, make and send a Christmas card to someone who lives far away, or drop off Christmas cookies for an elderly friend who lives alone. Don't make a big fussjust quietly share Jesus' love. After you're finished, talk about this:

What quiet surprise would you like to receive from someone?

#### **PRAY**

When everyone has shared, pray and thank God that he's quietly at work in our lives.

#### Digging Deeper

- 1. What was the name of the angel who visited Mary?
- 2. What did the angel tell Mary?
- 3. What are some things Gabriel said about Jesus?
- 4. How do you think Mary felt about giving birth to the Son of God?

#### Hands & Feet

As you write out Christmas cards pray for each family to whom you are sending it to. As you receive cards, pray for the families that sent them.

#### Memory Maker

Use the paper bag to make a stable for Jesus.

Color and cut out the Manger Scene and arrange it into the Nativity. Remember to wait until Christmas Day to put baby Jesus in the stable.

Each day, parents hide the star around the house. Children "seek" to find the star (just as the shepherds needed to follow the star to find Jesus). On Christmas day, the star is placed on top of the paper bag stable.
