PRAYER

Begin your time together by praying for new insight to understand the wonderful mysteries of God revealed in Christ.

MY STORY

1. Share a time in your life when someone went out of their way to help you or your family. What did they do, and how did your family receive the help?

DIGGING DEEPER

- 2. Was there an insight, principle or point that stood out to you from Sunday's message? Why?
- 3. **Read Luke 5:17-26.** What kind of sacrifices might the friends of the paralytic have made in taking him to Jesus? What do you think their actions did to the paralytic's faith?
- 4. One person defines "a friend" this way. "A friend is someone who comes in to help when the rest of the world has gone out." How would you define "a friend," and how does your definition fit the four friends of the paralytic?
- 5. A principle from the message was "sometimes we need to temporarily loan our faith to others." What does this mean, and how might you utilize this principle with someone in your sphere of influence?
